



The Brockintons in Belize

2015 August Newsletter



1. MIRACLES STILL HAPPEN: After Net, (our small groups), I got an emergency call that one of our Ketchi Mayan teens was really sick, way back in the village. Odillia is a tiny young lady. She is 18 or 19 years old, but stands about 4'5" tall. This is the same family that their thatch house burned down about 4 years ago. I had spoken to her 4 hours earlier about coming to Net and she was fine, but at 10pm this was the text I received from family. It read: "**Could you please call because Odillia is about dead!**" I was driving the teens home in the van, but immediately called. It took me about 30 minutes to get back there because I had to finish taking all the teens home. I tried to get a taxi to take her to the hospital, but that did not work.

My two oldest daughters and I headed back to pray for her. There are no street lights in that part of the village, so the village was totally black and soooo quiet. We had to walk about 200 yards through the mud in total darkness (except for a small flashlight) to their house. To be honest, I was a little scared, thinking guys with machetes were going to pop out and rob us. This is not uncommon at night, but I also knew what we were doing was important.

We came to this small, one room house, with no lights. All of their 6 Children were lying in hammocks. Mom was crying worried about Odillia. I felt Odillia's arm and she definitely had a fever. She had not spoken for over 2 hours - only mumbled and she couldn't walk.

So we did what all Believers do in times of desperation, we **laid hands on her and prayed for a miracle**. We finished praying and asked her if we could carry her to the hospital. She said, NO, which was the first time she spoke in over 2 hours. I felt her arm again to feel the fever, wanting to convince her to go to the hospital, but immediately realized the fever was 100% gone. (Oh my little faith). **She was instantaneously healed supernaturally by God!!!**

We left with the only casualty was our flip flops loaded down with an inch of mud on the bottom. The family asked if Feliciano, one of our Net Leaders back in the village, would stay with them for another 2 hours, which he did.

She shared a few days later that she began having pain in her jaw and then that is the last thing she remembers until she heard my voice praying for her. She said my voice sounded like I was speaking in a tunnel.

God is good and He is still engaged in the lives of His people in 2015.

2. FUNDING: I email my newsletter out to over **800 people and churches every month**. Out of those **800, less than 60 partner with us financially** on any given month. We are so grateful for all the financial support, with some support as small as \$10 and some larger. With your partnership, we are able to serve here in Belize. We are able to see miracles like Odillia, we are able to see lives transformed by God's power and we are able to establish a church that will be sustainable long after we are gone. Your partnership is touching Belize for years to come.



We would love to see our support expanded. There is always far more vision than finances. We have noticed a big inflation on food lately. Gas here is still around \$5 a gallon US. This year two financial partners needed to suspend their giving for a season and this as well presents the need to expand our financial partners.

3. BUILDING UPDATE: Our next step is the slab. We need about \$20,000US to complete this. One of our Nets just did a fundraiser and raised over \$1100US for the building. Progress continues. We hope to lay the slab within the next two months.

4. ADOPTION: Please continue to pray for us in the Adoption process. The process is very slow. My hope is to have our Nationality by the end of 2015 and therefore adopt Kailey in the early part of 2016. Please pray and believe God with us for favor.



5. SoCal District: Please lift up Robyn and I as we fly to California in September to speak to over 150 pastors. This District Conference will convey the vision to partner with the Foursquare churches in Belize for the next 2-3 years. The goal will be to equip our pastors and to help build our facility here in Belmopan.

6. WEDDING: I had the privilege of officiating a very, very, nice wedding here in Belmopan. We sat with the Mayor. I mentor the mayor on a weekly basis. Pray for him, he has the opportunity to influence lots of people for the Kingdom. Pray for me as I pour into him. This pretty cool car drove the bride.
